PRIVACY LAWS, THE COUNCILS AND MEMBER CLUBS

Following an enquiry by a Member club, enquiries were made of both the NSW and National Government departments seeking information on the application of Privacy Laws.

State legislation relates to actions of State Government authorities and agencies, and some private sector agencies unrelated to our club environment. It also contains provisions for conciliation towards resolutions of infringements.

Federal legislation from December 2002 covers privacy issues arising from the corporate activities of private firms and agencies with \$3 million plus annual turnover.

We are advised that:

- there are no privacy regulations or provisions specifically relevant to the operations of clubs or associations, such as our historic car clubs – either Federal or NSW,
- there are also no barriers or safety nets as protection against legal action on privacy issues.
- Specifically there are no provisions focused on publications and distribution of membership detail for clubs and associations.

Suggestions received during discussions with NSW Privacy Commission:

- For clubs to produce and publish a register of their membership, containing member details, there should be a right to do so, i.e., a constitutional right, which should include authority to collect and update data annually (or whatever).
- The purpose of the Register should be clear, e.g.,
 - i. for communication between members only
 - ii. not for distribution beyond club membership
 - iii. not for the use of any commercial or other non-club purpose or any purpose not authorized by the members
 - iv. or such other additions/deletions as the members require.
- The content of the register detail should be determined and accepted by the Members, e.g., name, phone, fax, vehicle details, addresses, etc. all, some, or other,
- Member commitment should be considered and any individual objection to inclusion of all or part of the data proposed should be respected,
- Joining and membership renewal forms should -
 - Note the Constitutional authority,
 - Note the purpose of the register and limitations on distribution,

Request the information approved by members to be sought,

Note objection rights.

Completion of the joining/annual renewal form then signifies the member's consent for detail to be included in the published register under the terms approved. A signature would be a useful add-on but was not considered necessary.

It is up to individual clubs to decide if they are relevant and whether to adopt the suggestions.

Advice pressed the points of common sense and respect of members' wishes, as well as security issues, e.g., publishing addresses - do members wish to publish the locations of their "goodies"?

Clubs must hold their Members responsible for the security and safeguard of their copy of the Register.
